Jerusalem 1967 Six Days that Changed the World

With the fortieth anniversary of Jerusalem's liberation and reunification approaching, many media outlets are presenting feature stories on the Six-Day War—some historically accurate and unbiased, but most not very reliable, and some transparently anti-Israel.

Forty years later the Six Day War remains a politically-charged subject, standing out among the various wars and upheavals that characterize Israel's short contemporary existence.

It's easy to understand why. At a moment Egypt, Syria and Jordan thought Israel would easily be driven into the blue Mediterranean, Israel turned the tables and miraculously pushed back her enemies on all fronts, more than tripled her land holdings, and liberated Jerusalem!

Although Israel had experienced the miracle of restoration of resurrection in 1948, it was only in part. Most of the biblically significant cities were off-limits and the holiest place on earth, the place of Solomon's Temple was inaccessible. After the Six Day War, Jerusalem was reclaimed—after near two-millennia—along with Hebron, where Abraham and Sarah are buried, ancient Jericho, Beth-El, and Shiloh. But most dramatic of all was the liberation of

Jerusalem. For Israel and the Arab world, the war changed everything. And yet the greatest impact was in the realm of the spirit.



June 4, 1967 Frenzied Arabs on the eve of the Six Day War, June, 1967, celebrate Egyptian President Abdel Nasser's promise to drive Israel into the Mediterranean Sea. On May 27, Nasser declared: "Our basic objective will be the destruction of Israel. The Arab people want to fight!" A signed a pact with Jordan, was a clear sign to Israel of impending regional war.

From the declaration of Israel's independence in May 1948, Israel has been plagued with violence from hostile neighbors. Nevertheless, they have dreamed of living securely in their Land at peace with the World. Despite little or no signs of reciprocity, Israel has consistently backed her expressed desires to negotiate for peace with the Arabs with one Land concession after another—to her detriment.

Ever the idealist, in her October 10, 1960 address to the U.N. Gen'l Assembly, Golda Meir entreated Arab leaders to meet with PM David Ben-Gurion to negotiate a peace settlement.

Egyptian President Nasser response was to announce that Egypt would never recognize the Jewish State.

Impending War

Over the next few years diplomacy deterioted as tension rose until 1967 brought the situation critical. Syria's shelling of Israeli farms and communities in the Galilee region from the Golan Heights with ever-increasing frequency finally provoked a necessary counter-strike in April 1967. Israel shot down six Soviet-supplied Syrian MiGs. Although Israel was protecting farms and villages from attack, Syria and the Soviet Union used it as an excuse to build up armaments for war upon the strategic Golan Heights towering 3,000 feet over Israel's Northern Galilee.

During these years, Egyptian President Nassar's threats became more bloodthirsty and bold. His hate-filled speeches inspired dozens of attacks within Israel and a tightening noose of military attack forces on Israel's borders—from Gaza to Golan.

When Nassar's Egyptian troops began amassing near Israel's Sinai border in mid-May 1967, while Syria strategically positioned on the Golan Heights for battle, Israel knew Nassar's threats. were not rhetoric—Israel was facing an impending invasion from Egypt on the South/East and Syria on the North/East.

Nasser ordered the UN Emergency Force, stationed in the Sinai since 1956, to withdraw on May 16. Secretary-General U Thant complied. After the withdrawal of the UNEF, on May 18, the Voice of the Arabs proclaimed: "As of today, there no longer exists an international emergency force to protect Israel. The sole method we shall apply against Israel is total war, which will result in the extermination of Zionist existence."

On May 20 Syrian Defense Minister Hafez Assad boasted: "Our forces are now entirely ready not only to repulse the aggression, but to initiate the act of liberation itself, and to explode the Zionist presence in the Arab homeland. The Syrian army, with its finger on the trigger, is united....I, as a military man, believe that the time has come to enter into a battle of annihilation."

June 5, 1967 Israeli forces launched a pre-emptive attack on Egypt and destroyed nearly 400 military aircraft. Very quickly neighboring Arab states joined Egypt in the battle. Israel suffered a great toll in securing their Syria and Jordan borders as the Arab states were well prepared, having built up their military forces as intelligence reported.

Nasser further goaded Israel to war by closing the Straits of Tiran to all shipping and cut access to Eilat on May 22. The blockade cut Israel's only supply route and cut off her supply of oil. Nasser challenged Israel to fight almost daily promising "Our basic objective will be the destruction of Israel. The Arab people want to fight," he said on May 27, "We will not accept any...coexistence with Israel."

On May 30, King Hussein of Jordan signed a pact with Egypt. Afterward, Nasser announced: "The armies of Egypt, Jordan, Syria and Lebanon are poised on the borders of Israel...to face the challenge, while standing behind us are the armies of Iraq, Algeria, Kuwait, Sudan and the whole Arab nation. This act will astound the world. Today they will know that the Arabs are arranged for battle, the critical hour has arrived. We have reached the stage of serious action and not declarations."

Iraq joined the furor as President Abdur Rahman Aref declared: "The existence of Israel is an error which must be rectified. This is our opportunity to wipe out the ignominy which has been with us since 1948."

With the armies of Egypt, Jordan, Syria and Lebanon poised on Israel's borders, Israel knew the time had come to act.

The Soviets had massively supplied the Arab armies surrounding Israel on all sides.

Israel was alone. Alone and surrounded by a quarter of a million armed Arab troops (half in the Sinai Peninsula), more than 2,000 tanks and 7000 enemy aircraft.

On June 5, 1967, Israel was indeed alone, but its military commanders had conceived a brilliant war strategy. The entire Israeli Air Force, with the exception of just 12 fighters assigned to defend Israeli air space, took off at 7:14 a.m. with the intent of bombing Egyptian airfields while the Egyptian pilots were eating breakfast. In less than 2 hours,

roughly 300 Egyptian aircraft were destroyed. A few hours later, Israeli fighters attacked the Jordanian and Syrian air forces, as well as one airfield in Iraq. By the end of the first day, nearly the entire Egyptian and Jordanian air forces, and half the Syrians', had been destroyed on the ground.

The battle then moved to the ground, and some of history's greatest tank battles were fought between Egyptian and Israeli armor in the blast-furnace conditions of the Sinai desert.

Jerusalem Is Attacked

Prime Minister Levi Eshkol sent a message to King Hussein on June 5 saying Israel would not attack Jordan unless he initiated hostilities. When Jordanian radar picked up a cluster of planes flying from Egypt to Israel, and the Egyptians convinced Hussein the planes were theirs, he ordered the shelling of West Jerusalem. It turned out that the planes were Israel's and were returning from destroying the Egyptian air force on the ground.

It took only three days for Israeli forces to defeat the Jordanian legion. On the morning of June 7, the order was given to recapture the Old City. Israeli paratroopers stormed the city and secured it. Defense Minister Moshe Dayan arrived with Chief of Staff Yitzhak Rabin to formally mark the Jews' return to their historic capital and their holiest site. At

the Western Wall, the IDF's chaplain, Rabbi Shlomo Goren, blew a shofar to celebrate the event.

A Stunning Victory

After just six days of fighting, Israeli forces were in a position to march on Cairo, Damascus, and Amman. By this time, the principal objectives of capturing the Sinai and the Golan Heights had been accomplished, and Israeli political leaders had no desire to fight in the Arab capitals. Furthermore, the Soviet Union had become increasingly alarmed by the Israeli advances and was threatening to intervene. At this point, U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk advised the Israelis "in the strongest possible terms" to accept a cease-fire. On June 10, Israel did just that.

The victory came at a very high cost. In storming the Golan Heights, Israel suffered 115 dead-roughly the number of Americans killed during Operation Desert Storm. Altogether, Israel lost twice as many men — 777 dead and 2,586 wounded-in proportion to her total population as the U.S. lost in eight years of fighting in Vietnam. (23) Also, despite the incredible success of the air campaign, the Israeli Air Force lost 46 of its 200 fighters. (24) The death toll on the Arab side was 15,000 Egyptians, 2,500 Syrians, and 800 Jordanians.

Israel 1967 - 2007 In spite of Israel's astonishing victory and massive land increase following the Six Day War, the next 40 years would be spent giving the land away in one peace pact after another, none of which brought any semblance peace. Rather, ever-escalating violence was what Israel has reaped, while the world and much of the Church continues to press for even greater concessions - those that would be disastrous for Israel's security - while the Arabs cry for her ultimate destruction ... and next the U.S. ... and then the Christians.



CENTER OF PROPHECY

JERUSALEM - Key to Revival

Look at the fig tree, and all the trees. When they are already budding, you see and know for yourselves that summer is now near. So you also, when you see these things happening, know that the kingdom of God is near. Assuredly, I say to you, this generation will by no means pass away till all things take place. (Luke 21:29-31)

As Israel recaptured Jerusalem in the Six Day War of 1967, almost simultaneously, sparks of revival began among the youth of the Haight-Ashbury district of San Francisco that would quickly ignite a fire across America and beyond known as the "Jesus Movement," a groundswell of evangelism and spontaneous salvation among primarily the youth and counter-culture.

Although history remembers other revivals, this one was uniquely characterized by something not seen since Yeshua (Jesus) and His first followers walked the Earth — considerable numbers of Jewish People coming to faith in Jesus who desired to maintain their life and identity as Jews. This was significant and prophetic. In preceding centuries relative handfuls of Jewish People had come to faith. In the 19th Century there were hundreds of

thousands that professed Christianity. Some of this was real but some was for social advancement. They largely assimilated into the traditional Church. Even with the advent of Jewish ministry societies forming in the late 1800s and early 1900s, and a renewed interest and anticipation of Prophecy after Israel regained statehood in 1948, the small numbers of Jews who came to faith either assimilated into traditional Christianity or became active as "Hebrew-Christians" in missionary work. They were generally trained or discipled by a traditional missionary society or a Christian denomination, and retained their Jewish identity only for the purpose of evangelism, not as a valid expression of worship and Christian lifestyle.

Yet after 1967, these new Jewish Believers expressed a strong sense and desire to retain their Jewish identity — to remain as they were when they were called — even as they were discipled in traditional churches. (1 Cor. 7: 20-24) There was an innate desire to "contend earnestly for the faith once delivered to the saints" (Jude 1:3) ... to restore the Tabernacle of David ... and to know their kinsman Redeemer — the Jewish Messiah of Israel. God was doing something new!

This in its essence was the spontaneous

birth of what today is called the "Messianic Movement," not organizationally, but spiritually. For the first time since the First Church, Jews in significant numbers were coming to faith in Yeshua and were free to be Jewish; they could retain their rich cultural heritage and restore scriptural riches that had languished in the dust. Igniting the Hebrew Roots movement, the Messianic Movement has brought new life to the Church as well, equipping her to fulfill Romans 11:11 — to make Israel envious for *her* God. Forty years have passed — a generation by biblical standards.

In these forty years since 1967 more Jewish People have come to faith in Yeshua by far than in any other century since Yeshua. There are now second generation Jewish Believers coming of age — modern-day Calebs and Joshuas of their generation.

THE TIMES OF THE GENTILES

Jerusalem will be trampled under foot by Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled. (Luke 21:24 NASB)

It is clear that the June 1967 Six Day War which liberated Jerusalem and restored control to the Jewish People, was a momentous event for Israel. Although the miracle of



statehood was realized in 1948, access to the Temple Mount – the holiest place on Earth to the Jewish People (not the Arabs – that is a myth) was denied. In fact, the Jews were only allowed a portion of Jerusalem; the city was divided. The victory of the Six Day War unified Jerusalem under Jewish authority. That was in the natural realm; in the realm of the Spirit, it was as if a giant celestial clock, long sleeping, came to life, sending the hands forward decisively with a resounding report throughout the Earth, signaling an epic shift in Christianity and the lifting of the veil between Israel and her Messiah. The world is now filled with Jewish Believers and Messianic Congregations. In tiny Israel alone there are approximately fifty Jewish congregations!

Yeshua sets the restoration of Jerusalem as

a signpost for us. Previous generations looking for His return lacked this important criterion. Although not complete, the "fullness" or "times of the Gentiles" are certainly in the present. The restoration of Israel as a Nation, the reunification of Jerusalem under Israeli control, and the returning of Judah and the Tribes of Israel from the four corners of the Earth add up to an unprecedented amount of fulfilled prophecy in the last century. Consider also Yeshua's own admonishment to Jerusalem: "for I say to you, you shall see Me no more till you say, 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!" (Matt. 23:39 NKJV) The Jewish People had to be back in the Land and specifically Jerusalem to cry out to Him from Psalm 118 for Yeshua to return.

It seems all eyes are on Israel, and specifi-

cally Jerusalem. Why does the world contend over this miniscule piece of real estate that has no oil, no diamond mines, seemingly no intrinsic value to anyone? Even Christians have become contentious over the political issues, missing the gravity of Israel's biblical mandate.

It is often noted that Israel is God's timepiece. If that is true, the hour must be growing late. Are we fast approaching the time of completion, when all Israel will be saved?

For I do not desire, brethren, that you should be ignorant of this mystery, lest you should be wise in your own opinion, that blindness in part has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in. And so all Israel will be saved. (Romans 11:25,26 NKIV).


